

A Message from Our Executive Director

At one point or another in each of our lives, we will rely on a nurse. Hopefully, it will not be in a critical, life threatening situation but if it is, we are going to want a top notch, experienced, and highly skilled clinician standing by us.

I understand the important role these clinicians play in caring for patients. As the mother and caregiver of an infant diagnosed with leukemia, I followed my son's nurses' lead during the two years of intense treatment at renowned teaching hospitals in North Carolina. Not only did they provide exemplary care throughout his lengthy stays, they offered me guidance, took time to teach me ways to keep him safe and as comfortable as possible, and held my hand through the rough patches. From the nurse assistants to the nurse practitioners, each one kept my head above water throughout the entire experience. Even today, nearly 20 years later, many of them still check on me from time to time.



Nurses are on the front lines every day. They not only need to excel in their profession so that they may provide their patients with quality care, but they also

have to act as our advocate, our guide, and in many cases, our friend. The weight of caring for patients is not just about meds and vitals. It is so much more. The State of Nursing in America

The national nursing shortage continues to make headline news. An April 2023 report by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing highlights the crisis and why growing America's nursing workforce is so critical.

Key findings include:

100,000

Approximate number of registered nurses (RNs) that left the workforce during the COVID-19 pandemic in the past two years due to stress, burnout and retirements.

610,388

Additional RNs reported an "intent to leave" the workforce by 2027 due to stress, burnout and retirement.

188,962 more RNs under 40 years old reported similar intentions.

1/5

of RNs nationally are projected to leave the health care workforce.



50.8%

nurses reported feeling emotionally drained a few times a week or every day.

56.4% "used up"

49.7% "fatigued"

45.1% "burned out"

29.4% "at the end of the rope"

These issues were most pronounced with nurses with 10 or fewer years of experience, driving an overall 3.3% decline in the U.S. nursing workforce in the past two years.

Licensed practical/vocational nurses, who generally work in long-term care settings caring for the most vulnerable populations, have seen their ranks decline by 33,811 since the beginning of the pandemic. This trend continues.

Financial Support

GHF was established to support nursing education. However, shortly after launching we became aware of clinicians facing homelessness, medical emergencies and other crises. Recognizing broader needs, the GHF board voted to expand our mission to include financial support for other hardships. GHF assistance efforts now include the following:

Housing Assistance

To provide financial assistance for suitable and safe housing. Assistance includes moving expenses, required security deposits, monthly rent payments, utility deposits, utilities (water, sewer, power), and/or other financial obligations as determined by the rental agreement.

Emergency Assistance

To provide emergency financial assistance during events resulting in loss of income including bereavement, natural disaster, sickness/injury, or other unpreventable situation.

As a result of these efforts, in our first year, six families were provided financial assistance to help with housing, food and other necessities. An additional family was placed in a hotel for one week by a donor who chose to support the Foundation's efforts anonymously.

Here are a few examples of how GHF clinicians regain stability for themselves and their families:

"Alondra" was thankfully at work and her children were in school when her home was completely destroyed in a house fire. This devastating event caused 100% loss of all personal belongings. She sought help from local agencies, but resources were limited. GHF assisted with the first month's rent and deposits that allowed the family to move into a new home. In the middle of all this, her son attempted to end his life and the family was forced to seek additional assistance from their local Social Services agency to get him the help he needed. As she dealt with this crisis, she expressed gratitude to GHF for helping her with a home. She noted that with that taken care of, she could focus on caring for her son.

"Charlotte" had spent years in an abusive relationship, and although she eventually found the courage to leave, she had to work excessively to provide for herself and her three children. The abuser has been arrested and is currently serving his sentence. Even with these stresses, she was often recognized for the exceptional care she provides to her patients. To help her gain independence, GHF provided a month's rent and grocery store as well as a few gift cards to help with a few gifts for her children at Christmas. Afterwards, she contacted GHF in tears to share how much the intervention helped her and her children's state of mind. She spoke about how they had nearly given up hope that they couldn't make it "one step further" and today, they are in a safe place that they can call home.
